

WHAT CAN YOU DO?

- o Hold all companies involved in making, using or transporting pellets accountable by law;
- o Compel companies to follow and respect specific guidelines to prevent pellet loss;
- Impose that all staff are trained; Set legal obligations for frequent and independent third party audits of these companies;
- o Ensure that companies are working together across the supply chain;
- Penalise pellet spills in the environment;
- o Deny permits for new infrastructure aiming at increasing plastic production in Europe
