

Operation Clean Sweep®: a voluntary programme of the plastics industry



In order to take its responsibility, PlasticsEurope has started to promote OCS in Europe since 2014 with the objective of **zero pellet/powder/flake loss!**

It is a voluntary <u>free</u> initiative <u>aimed at improving awareness</u>, <u>promoting best practices and providing guidance and tools</u> to support its signatories in the implementation of the necessary pellet loss prevention measures.

By signing the OCS pledge, each company handling raw materials recognises the **importance of preventing spillages into the environment** and commits to OCS by implementing the following 6 actions:

- 1 Improve our worksite(s) set-up to prevent and address spills;
- 2 Create and publish internal procedures to achieve «zero pellet loss» goals;
- 3 Provide employee training and accountability for spill prevention, containment, clean-up and disposal;

- 4 Audit our performance regularly;
- 5 Comply with all applicable local and national regulations governing pellet containment;
- 6 Encourage our partners (contractors, transporters, etc.) to pursue the same objectives.





OCS signatories uptake in 2022





- More than 1600 signatories of OCS in Europe
 - All PlasticsEurope members have signed up to OCS since 2019
 - All EU associations from Plastics value chain confirmed their commitment to OCS in 2020
 - Main increase in the converters & logistics/transport sectors

OCS certification scheme: the upcoming major milestone



In 2020, PlasticsEurope and EuPC started to develop of a transparent auditable scheme for the management of pellet loss in Europe:

- Applicable to plastics producers, converters, transporters and logistics and potentially other value-chain partners
- Supervised by a multi-external stakeholders group (policy-makers, NGOs, certification bodies, industry)

In order to be OCS certified, companies will be **audited by 3rd party auditors** on OCS Europe Essential Requirements; OCS certification scheme also include **annual reporting elements** (such as estimated pellet loss) to trade associations.

- → improved transparency, accountability and credibility of OCS programme
- → More consistent and harmonized implementation of OCS programme across the different companies



Objectives of OCS certification scheme



- Certification scheme launched in 2022
- By 2025 :
- 100% of PlasticsEurope's members certified
- 60% of quantities of European converters and compounders certified
- 2024-2025, review and improvement of the scheme and requirements based on experience acquired during the 1st certification cycle
