Background:

Water:

There is an increasingly prevalent message from the international community: involve and implicate a broad range of actors linked to water, to participate in the decision making of water allocation and use. This is the UN Water directive when encouraging achievement of SDG 6, the underlying factor behind the WEF Nexus approach, the first step urged by high-level policy dialogues and technical roadmaps. There is a recurring theme of inclusion and multi-dimensionality defining the efforts towards water security. All projections alarm on the critical need to agree on the distribution of freshwater between sectors and people, and the imperative to do so by innovative means, whether digital and technical, financial or methodological. What are therefore the actions implemented by DG INTPA and DG NEAR, the European Commission, and its delegations, in line with this message?

<u>Ocean</u>

Over 3 billion people depend on marine and coastal ecosystems for their livelihoods and food security. These ecosystems are also vital for climate change mitigation, adaptation, disaster risk reduction, etc. These ecosystems are disappearing globally at a very high rate, because they are particularly vulnerable to the impacts of climate change, pollution, coastal development, artificialisation, and overexploitation. Developing countries are particularly vulnerable to the consequences of this degradation, since the economy of many of them is based on marine and coastal-related sectors, such as fishing and tourism. At the same time, the ocean is also a vital source of sustainable economic opportunities, and it is critical that developing countries be in a position to turn new and emerging ocean-based sectors into catalysts for long-term, nature-positive, climate-sensitive and inclusive sustainable development. How can the EC and its Delegations better integrate marine and coastal nature-based solutions and sustainable blue economic activities in their actions?
