I. CONTEXT

As part of the water component of the EU funded 'Water and Environment Support (WES) project in the ENI Southern Neighbourhood region' project, an activity entitled "Evaluation of new methods to reduce the cross subsidies in the agricultural water tariff in Israel". This follows a major reform, whereby the Israel Water Authority is in the process of evaluation, examination and search of new methods to reduce the cross-subsidies in the agricultural sector.

The activity which falls under Component 2 of the WES project "Water Use Efficiency" aims to improve 'Water Resources Valuation, Cost Recovery, Affordability of water services' corresponding to Topic 3.1: Tariffs. The **general objective** of the activity is to assist Israel in the implementation of its water reform emanating from the 2017 "Amendment 27" to the Water Law, with regards to the planned reduction of cross-subsidies in the water tariff of the agricultural sector.

The specific objectives of the activity are:

- a) Broad review of agricultural water tariffs and subsidies, methods and practices in leading OECD countries successes and failures analysis.
- b) Profound 2-3 case studies of countries with major efficient reforms in the agricultural sector related to subsidies through water tariffs or alternative mechanisms.
- c) Recommend new methods for supporting the agricultural sector (such as government budget, and other methods of direct subsidies) and sustaining farming based on the review and the case studies.

II. TARGET ZONE

Though the water management in Israel, including economic regulation, is at national level, the emphasis of this specific study will be on the Northern part of Israel. In this area, agriculture is based on potable water sources only (with no alternatives of sufficient treated effluents or brackish water for irrigation or because of a hydrologically sensitive area where the irrigation with effluents is prohibited). As such, the agriculture in the area must pay a higher tariff than previously for the same crops.







III. WORKSHOP OBJECTIVES

The workshop aims to:

- 1. Present an overview of the national activity in Israel.
- 2. Present the results of the activity and introduce the methods and practices that were investigated in the case studies.

IV. EXPLORE THE APPLICABILITY OF THE PRACTICES AND SELECTED METHODS TO ISRAEL PARTICIPATION
