




Major conflict in the region since October 2023 has also affected the project.

- Activities that are ongoing are affected: slowed down or put on hold no physical meetings, missions - feedback from stakeholders pending – mostly emergency actions on the ground;
- Communication and feedback from the Focal Points slowed down;
- Participation of trainees in the project's events hindered/not possible;
- Communication and exchanges with the Demonstration projects based in Gaza affected;
- Risk of very limited time being available for the eventual completion of these activities when conditions will allow it.
- Impact of completed/advanced activities may be affected.

The project has strong adaptation mechanisms and mentality to navigate the project during its final year.

It will be monitoring the situation closely, in collaboration with the Programme Manager, putting its available skills and resources to full use.









Three activities cancelled after preparations made and delays experienced already, due to change of prioritisation in the countries:

 two activities in Algeria on plastics recycling - one Activity in Lebanon on marine litter monitoring



- documentation submission takes longer.


We need to start the participants' visa procedure and other preparations, at least 3,5 months before the event's time.

Depuis octobre 2020, le projet « Appui dans les domaines de l'eau et de l'environnement (WES) dans le voisinage Sud de l'instrument européen de voisinage (IEV) », financé par l'UE, s'est engagé dans la mise en œuvre d'une activité intitulée « potentiel de l'efficiacité de l'utilisation de l'eau et de la consommation d'eau domestique » pour soutenir le service public de l'eau « l'Algérienne Des Eaux » (ADE) dans le développement de stratégies d'intervention efficaces visant à réduire la consommation d'eau domestique.

#### Après deux formations et l'enquête sur l'efficacité de l'utilisation de l'eau dans le secteur résidentiel, le WES a conclu avec succès son activité en organisant un atelier de consultation, le 23 octobre 2023, dans la ville de Ramla, dans la commune de Bejaia, en Algérie.

Au cours de la consultation, l'équipe d'experts en eau du WES a présenté une vue d'ensemble de l'activité nationale du WES en Algérie. A la fin de la présentation des résultats de l'activité, la feuille de route pour la mise à l'échelle des résultats de l'activité, et les opportunités de mise en œuvre de mesures/programmes d'utilisation rationnelle de l'eau et leurs avantages, ont fait l'objet d'un débat approfondi entre les parties prenantes. Une série d'actions possibles à mettre en œuvre par le pays, audelà de la durée du projet, a été proposée.

L'un des thèmes clés de cet événement, concernait la sensibilisation des partenaires, des bénéficiaires et des parties prenantes aux options disponibles pour réduire la consommation d'eau et aux moyens d'y parvenir.

In my capacity as WES Team Leader, I am grateful for the satisfaction expressed by all participants of the 4th WES Steering Committee Meeting (SCM), held online on January 24, 2023, for the work carried out during 2022 and the unanimous endorsement of our ambitious Workplan for the year 2023.
